

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### BAE, JEONG-MOON

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Born in Cheong-ju, Korea in 1968, I have worked as a sculptor over 25 years after graduating from Chungbuk National University, S. Korea. I have become more interested in installation art since I was an artist–in–residence in Cheongju Art Studio in 2008. As a member of Korean Fine Arts Association, I have done solo exhibitions 7 times with numerous group exhibitions and I had 10 invitation exhibitions around the country.

I have been trying to understand life and death in Buddist point of view and show what I understood through various installation art works. This work 'Muah' (absence of ego) is my meditation about people who are constantly making up their own stories in their lives even though they are filled with the things they can't choose. I was born a man and have been living as a sculptor desperately, which is helping me to understand my true self.






Muah(absence of ego) born.be.close Iron tube 7.8 × 7.8 × 28(H) inches 2021

Fred Bendheim was born in Arizona, U.S.A. in 1956. He has had numerous exhibitions in galleries and museums, and his works are in collections world-wide: The Museum of Arts and Design, NYC, The Montclair Art Museum, The Scottsdale Museum of Contemporary Art, The National Museum of Costa Rica. The Neiman-Marcus Collection. Bradlev International Airport, The Brooklyn Public Library, Sotheby's and others. His sculpture commissions include two fountain/sculptures for Frank Lloyd Wright buildings. His painting commissions have been in the finest buildings in the world. As well as painting, he has made: murals, drawings, prints, collages, sculpture, and illustrations. As a teen-ager, he apprenticed with artist, Philip Curtis. Fred attended the University of California, Davis, and graduated from Pomona College, with a B.A. cum laude. He has lived and worked in Brooklyn, NY since 1983, maintaining a studio in Sunset Park. He is a teaching artist at The Art Student's League, and other schools in NYC. His past art has taken the form of large room-sized installations, outdoor billboards with children's art, sculptures, and fountains made with many materials, as well as mural-sized drawings. He has written numerous articles about art for the British journal, The Lancet. His art has taken him throughout the world, including several artist residences in Costa Rica and Berlin, Germany.

Iksong Jin was born in South Korea in 1960.

After he graduated from Hong-Ik University in Seoul, KOREA, he moved to New York in 1988 and studied at NYU (New York University) and he received Masters Degree in 1991.

His works have been exhibited in New York including 'OK Harris Works of Art' (383 West Broadway) as well as in Korea, Japan, UK.

Iksong received British Council Grant in 1996-97 and studied at Northumbria University, Newcastle, UK for the Post Doc. Fellow.

He is presently a professor at Fine Arts Dept. at Chungbuk National University in South Korea.

In the year 2014, he had a sabbatical year and was invited from 'The Art Students League of New York' to give lectures.

He had lectured at Green Mountain College and the Carving Studio in Vermont in 2005 and 'Flux Factory' and 'Residency Unlimited' in New York.

## JOSEPH PIASENTIN (1950-)



Joseph Piasentin was born in San Mateo, California and received an MFA from Stanford University in 1977. He has taught at Pomona College, the Claremont Graduate School, Studio Art Centers International in Florence, Italy, and Pepperdine University in Malibu, where he is a Professor Emeritus. Joseph Piasentin has also been an artist-in-resident at the Santa Fe Art Institute in Santa Fe, New Mexico, (1998). He exhibits nationally and internationally with work represented in many private and public collections that include Long Beach Museum of Art, Taiwan Museum of Modern Art, Thailand Cultural Center -Bangkok, Lyon City Collection, American Airlines, Stanford University, and Bank of America to name several. Joseph Piasentin moved his painting studio from Santa Monica to Ojai, California, in 2001 where he currently lives with his wife Rebecca.

#### ARTIST STATEMENT

Rather than picture or image, the pieces I refer to as "Woodies" fulfil within me a need to find physical substance. Remnants of sticks, boards, molding and other pieces of wood once used for different purposes, become conveyors of texture, shape and color in relationships discovered through a totally intuitive response. Similar in process to the collage, recurrent construction motivated by curiosity, investigation and material reveals direction. Through encounters and decisions made from many options, and while seeking connections, imperatives emerge for each individual work.

## STEVEN BALOGH

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In 1986 he left Hungary and spent seven months as refugee in the Flüchtlingslager of Traiskirchen, Austria. His passport was confiscated, his official status was stateless person.

In the same year based on a decision by the United Nations Office in Vienna, he was granted asylum to 19 countries. He arrived to the United States on November 20, 1986, with nothing but a plastic bag of the International Rescue Committee, containing a few personal items of necessity.

He settled down in New York City, and live, work there ever since. In 1995 he became US citizen.

Steven Balogh's art figures in the permanent collections of museums in the US and Hungary. He has participated in dozens of group shows in Europe, the USA and Asia with great artists: Matisse, Christo, Mapplethorpe... He had 21 solo exhibitions, 4 of them recently in New York City.
